Dear Sirs,

With reference to previous correspondence respecting the case of the steamer "STYLIANOS COUTSODONTIS", I beg to inform you that the Committee have to-day had before them a report received from the Society's Surveyors at Piraeus of an examination made of this vessel at Salonica afloat, where she is at present laid up.

As you are aware, this vessel sustained extensive damage through grounding on her voyage from Germany to Salonica, and this examination has also been made consequent on the damage sustained through stranding in May at Europa Point.

The Surveyors add that nothing was done at this time towards the completion of the survey, in view of the damage which has been sustained, and that the Owners are awaiting a decision as to what action will be taken regarding the repairs, before proceeding with the completion of the survey.

It is understood that the vessel is meanwhile laid up at Salonica, but I have to say that the Committee are not prepared to grant any further extension, and must require the
