S.S. "STYLIANOS COUTSODONTIS".

I beg to advise you that the report of the damage sustained in Nos. 1 and 2 holds of the above steamer through stranding at point on the 28th May 1932 has been handed to Messrs. Henderson, Lloyd's Agents, Piraeus.

I may say that in my opinion no further temporary repairs are required to enable the vessel to proceed to a port of repair. I point out that the Committee agreed to the vessel loading at Salonica on the understanding that the remaining items of Special Survey No. 3 would be carried out without fail on her return to Greece. Should you desire that the vessel load for her voyage, with a view to returning to the United Kingdom or to carry out the damage repairs and complete the Special Survey, it would require to obtain the Committee's sanction for the voyage.

I may add that in the event of the Committee being agreeable to the vessel's return to the United Kingdom, a certificate could be granted to enable her to load dry cargo for the voyage.
