The class is subject to the upper scarp of stern frame, repaired by electric welding 9,26 and 3,28, and the lower scarp of the stern frame and rudder coupling, repaired by the same process 3,28, being specially examined at the next dry docking and to some indented shell plating on starboard side being dealt with at the Owners' convenience.

The Genoa Surveyors report this ship examined afloat and the requirements of the 1st S.S. No.3, due 1,35, partly complied with.

It is added the Special Survey was not continued as the Owners intimated that, for reasons of economy, the ship's class was desired to be withdrawn. (See also letter attached)

It is submitted the class of this ship be withdrawn from the Register Book and three dots (...) inserted in lieu, indicating withdrawal of class at the Owners' request.
