Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th instant, in regard to certain chain cable which has been ordered from you by Messrs. Cook, Welton & Gemmell for their Nos. 195 & 196 vessels, and in reply I am directed to say that, if the Owners of these trawlers desire the chain cables to be supplied in 30-fm. lengths, the Committee will approve of the same, provided the cables are tested as required by the Anchors & Chain Cables Act. If the cables are sent to the Proving House in 15-fm. lengths they will, after testing, have to be joined with ordinary links into 30-fm. lengths, the "joiners" being subsequently tested. The certificates of test will be endorsed accordingly.

I am sending the necessary instructions to the Superintendent of the Netherton Proving House.

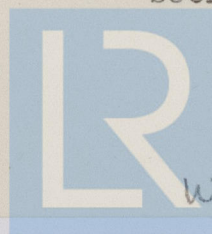
