With reference to our telegram of the 22nd and to your letter of the 23rd instant, respecting the above vessel, we are forwarding herewith enclosed the Owners' letter of 25th inst. together with free translation of same, from which you will note that they request the withdrawal of the vessel's class from the Society's Register Book.

Yesterday, we tried repeatedly to get into touch with the Manager of the Company, Captain A. Corrado, but we were only able to speak to his Head Clerk, to whom the contents of your letter were communicated, especially pointing out that the year of grace expires at the end of July next, and therefore, it would have been sufficient, for retaining the class with this Society, to have the surveys completed by that time.


