S. I beg to acquaint you that a copy of your letter of the 20th October last, respecting your vessels "KAHOKU MARU", "KAIRYU MARU", "KANAN MARU", "SANSEI MARU", "SANTO MARU" and "TONAN MARU", addressed to the Society's Surveyor at Dairen, has been forwarded to this Office, and the same has been submitted to the Committee at their Meeting today, together with a letter, dated 25th ultimo, received from the Society's Dairen Surveyor, stating that you have definitely decided to withdraw these six ships from class at present.


