Dear Sir,
I am in receipt of your letter of the 11th inst.

concerning the proposed charter of the vessel "The Bremen" to be chartered by the Bremen Reederei for the purpose of carrying passengers and cargo to and from the ports of the Baltic Sea and the North Sea. The vessel is a steamship of 1,200 tons, built in 1928, and is capable of carrying 100 passengers and 1,000 tons of cargo. The proposed charter is for a period of 12 months, commencing on the 1st of January 1931, and terminating on the 31st of December 1931. The charter is to be on a bareboat basis, and the vessel is to be crewed by a crew of 20 men. The charter is to be for the purpose of carrying passengers and cargo to and from the ports of the Baltic Sea and the North Sea. The vessel is to be capable of carrying 100 passengers and 1,000 tons of cargo. The proposed charter is for a period of 12 months, commencing on the 1st of January 1931, and terminating on the 31st of December 1931. The charter is to be on a bareboat basis, and the vessel is to be crewed by a crew of 20 men.
