the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. Mitsubishi Denki Kaisha, Ltd., attend at their works at Nagasaki, on the 19th March 1931, for the purpose of examining under test the following Switchboard intended for Vessel No.490, now being built by Messrs. Mitsubishi Zosen Kaisha, Ltd. Nagasaki.

One Complete Main Switchboard, No.61378, consisting of the following:-

- Two panels for Lighting.
- Two panels for Deck Part Motors and Heaters.
- Two panels for 3.5 K.W. Generator.
- Six panels for Three 65 K.W. Generators.
- Four panels for Engine Part Motors.

A high pressure voltage test of 2000 volts A.C. was applied to all panels for one minute, insulation tests, temperature rise tests under continuous current and calibration tests were carried out as detailed below and all found satisfactory.

Two 450 amps, circuit breakers on Lighting Panel and Deck Part & Heater Panel.

- Continuous current of 450 amps at 220 volts for 4½ hours.
- " " of 562.5 " " " 2 hours.
- Calibration tests at 360, 450, 630 & 900 amps for Overload Relay.

Three 350 amps, circuit breakers on 65 K.W. Generator Panels.

- Continuous current of 350 amps at 220 volts for 4½ hours.
- " " of 437.5 " " " 2 hours.
- Calibration tests at 280, 350, 490 & 700 amps for Overload Relay.
- " " at 17, 35 & 70 amps for Reverse current " "
