the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of

the Owners' Representative carry out on the 12th June, 1942 and subsequent dates, the General Examination of the Steamer "START POINT", 5293 tons gross of Newcastle, for maintenance of class, the Freeboard Renewal Survey, and did examine internally and externally the three boilers, whilst the vessel was both afloat and in Dry Dock in the Alexandra Dock, Hull.

The notation "Examined 8.42 (12 months)" is now recommended, together with a fresh record of survey 8.42, and the fresh record of B.S. 8.42, on completion of the Boiler Survey.

The class of the vessel is subject to shell plating above tunnel recess starboard side aft, (electric welded 2.41) being specially examined at the next docking, and indented shell plates F4 and G3 (port side) being dealt with at first opportunity.

To complete the Boiler Survey the boiler mountings require to be opened out and examined and the safety valves of all boilers adjusted under steam.
