Dear Sirs,

S. With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the steamer "LEVANTE", which has been laid up at Amsterdam for some time past, I beg to inform you that the Committee have, up to the present, agreed to the vessel's class remaining undisturbed in the Book on a written undertaking, furnished by the late Owners, that the overdue Second Special Survey No.2 would be carried out before the vessel proceeded to sea, and that, in the event of her sale, intending purchasers would be informed of the conditions under which the vessel's class had been continued.

I have now received a letter from the Society's Surveyors at Amsterdam stating that the vessel has been purchased by your goodselves and that you do not intend to maintain this Society's class.

In these circumstances the Committee have had no alternative but to follow their usual practice in such cases and have accordingly given instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.
