Dear Sir,

With further reference to my letter of yesterday's date regarding the above vessel, I have to inform you that I have now received a telegram from the Society's Surveyors at Nagasaki stating that she left Hikoshima Dock, yesterday morning, without being surveyed.

It was only yesterday morning that the Society's Surveyors in Shanghai telegraphed regarding the docking, and I at once telegraphed to the Society's Nagasaki Surveyors. Nagasaki is some seven hours by train from Hikoshima and apparently they had received no request for survey when the vessel entered the dock.

In your letter of the 19th May you intimated that arrangements would be made for a general examination to be carried out in Japan this month, and as these arrangements
