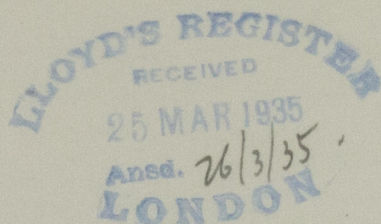

Dear Mr. Scott,

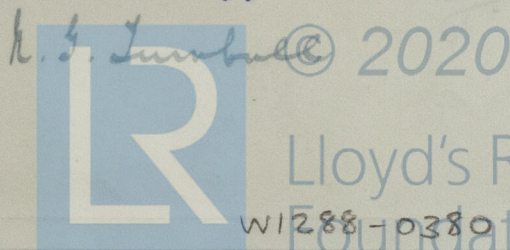
I am in receipt of your letter of 22nd instant and note your remarks regarding the case of the steamer "OAKGROVE".

I quite appreciate that the Owners' decision regarding this vessel is definite, but what I really had in mind was whether you consider it would be desirable for the Owners to be approached with a view to their other ship, the "OLIVEGROVE", being retained in Class.

I am not aware that there is any present proposal to transfer her to the British Corporation, and the Special Survey No. 2 does not become due until 1937, but it is possible that a word in time may ensure this vessel remaining in Lloyd's Register instead of being transferred as in the case of the sister vessel.
