I was duly favoured with your letter of the 19th instant, enclosing one from the Owners of the steamer "OAKGROVE", intimating they are transferring this vessel to the British Corporation classification.


I may say that a report was recently received from Middlesbrough, where the vessel had been laid up since the beginning of the year, of a general examination preliminary to carrying out the Third Special Survey No.1. On the 13th instant the Surveyors were informed by the Owners' Representative that the vessel had been granted a certificate by the British Corporation to proceed to the Tyne. We immediately wrote to the Glasgow Office with a view to the matter being taken up direct with the Owners, and on the 18th instant Mr. Warlow replied that the Owners had definitely decided not to continue the classification of the vessel in the Society's Register Book.

I am afraid therefore, in view of the above and the result of your enquiries that it is not possible to take any further steps to influence the Owners in the matter.
