Dear Sir,

S. With reference to your memorandum of the 14th January last respecting the steamer "OAKGROVE", I have to inform you that a report has now been received from the Society's Surveyors at Middlesbrough of a general examination of the vessel afloat.

The Surveyors have recommended that the vessel should be chipped throughout for further examination, but the Owners' Representative has informed them that he was not prepared to carry out the recommendations.

The Surveyors were informed by the Agent on the 13th instant that the vessel had left for the Tyne on the 12th instant, having been granted a certificate by the British Corporation. The Middlesbrough Surveyors therefore presume it is the Owners' intention to class the vessel with that Society, but as no information has been received direct from the Owners regarding this matter, I shall be glad if you will be good enough to approach them with a view to ascertaining their intentions.
