Dear Sirs,

S. I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th instant respecting the steamer "AGIOS VLASIOS", and to say that a letter has also come to hand from the Owner of this vessel, Mr. John D. Chandris, who states that she is loading in Cuba for the Mediterranean, and requests the Committee to agree to the Special Survey No.2 and repairs being deferred until her arrival in Piraeus.

In view of the condition of this vessel, as set forth in my letter to you of the 3rd December last, the Committee are very surprised to find that the Owner has not taken the necessary steps to arrange for the Special Survey and repairs to be carried out before loading the cargo in question.

It is observed from the Shipping Papers that the vessel left Emden on the 3rd instant for Cuba, and it is considered that before ~~proceeding~~ proceeding on her voyage the Owner should have arranged for the survey to have been held, especially as the year of grace, as

has been previously pointed out, expires at the end of this month.

The case will be submitted to the Committee on Wednesday next, when no doubt they will have no alternative but to deal with the vessel's class.
