Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 26th ultimo, respecting the Engines Nos. 8752 A & B constructed by Messrs. Hughes & Lancaster (Liverpool reports Nos. 80720 & 80721 respectively) I have to inform you with regard to the concluding paragraph of your letter that as these engines appear to have been ordered by the Admiralty and were originally intended for Admiralty Drifters, the fee for the survey during construction, viz:- double the ordinary first entry and classification fees, is payable by the Engine makers.

In each of these cases therefore the fee chargeable will be the minimum fee of £9, and you will be good enough to render an account accordingly to Messrs. Hughes & Lancaster.
