Dear Sirs,

H. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th ultimo relative to the stream and kedge anchors of the steamer "PRESIDENT GOMEZ", and in reply I think it well to point out that under a recent alteration in the Society's Rules, kedge anchors are no longer required to be supplied to vessels classed in the Society's Register Book. I may say that a letter to this effect was addressed from this Office on the 26th ultimo to the Anglo-Saxon Petroleum Company Ltd., and it was suggested to them that arrangements should be made for the stream anchor to be submitted to inspection by one of the Society's Surveyors at the first convenient opportunity upon the vessel's call at a port where a Surveyor to this Society is stationed. Lloyd's Agents at Curacao were advised accordingly and informed that in the circumstances it would not be necessary for them to appoint a Surveyor in this instance. You will therefore see that the question of the amount of the fee to be charged by Lloyd's Agents at Curacao no longer arises.
