I am in receipt of your letter of the 23rd instant, enclosing one from Messrs. Wright, Johnston & Mackenzie in regard to the case of the S.S. "CAMOSUN", and in reply I am directed to request that you will be good enough to inform the above named Firm to the following effect.

The instructions to Non-Exclusive Surveyors to forward to this Office copies of all reports of surveys on classed vessels were issued prior to 1905. The Society's Surveyors both Exclusive and Non-Exclusive at Foreign ports are at liberty to prepare specifications for repairs and act on behalf of Owners in such matters.

As stated in my letter of the 3rd September, 1912, there are no copies in this Office of any damage survey reports issued by the Surveyors to this Society at San Francisco on the 19th, 20th, and 26th May, and 15th June, 1905. If such copies had been received here, they would have been attached to the Surveyors repair report which was forwarded to you on the 8th August last and is now in the custody of the Court
