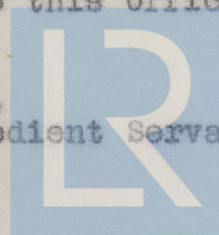
D. I duly received your letter of the 29th ultimo, with enclosures, and your telegram of even date, in further reference to the case of the S.S. "CAMOSUN". With regard to Messrs. Wright, Johnston & Mackenzie's letter to you of the 29th ultimo, I have to request that you will be good enough to inform those gentlemen that there are no copies in this Office of any damage survey reports issued by the Surveyor to this Society at San Francisco on the 19th, 20th and 26th May and the 15th June, 1905, and that if such copies had been in existence here they would have been attached to the Surveyor's report which was forwarded to you for the purpose of the above case on the 8th August.

I shall be glad if you will also intimate to Messrs. Wright, Johnston & Mackenzie, in reply to their inquiry, that in all cases in which the Society's Surveyors abroad issue damage survey reports on vessels it is usual for them to forward copies of such reports to this Office for the information of the Committee.
