Dear Mr. Redman,


I am in receipt of your letter of the 15th instant respecting the case of the S.S. "CAMOSUN" and note what you say.

I had to hand the documents over in accordance with the Sheriff's request and other parties present (notably a representative of the Registrar General) had to do the same.

The procedure does not appear to be the same as in the English Courts. In this case the Actual trial before a Judge will not probably take place for some months, the intervening time being occupied in collecting evidence and documents on commission. A solicitor for the Pursuers and one for the Defenders proceed to Vancouver in a week or two to collect evidence on commission there and when this has been completed the case will come up for trial. I made a point of asking whether I could have access to the documents if required and the solicitors assured me I could see them at any time.
