Dear Sir,

S. I am in receipt of your letter of yesterday's date having reference to the steamer "MARIE THERESE LE BORGNE", now lying in the Barcelona district in a damaged condition.

With regard to surveying duties at that port I may say that Mr. Rennie returned to this country some months ago but that the clerk Senorita Purita Navarro is keeping on the Office and arranges for the appointment of Surveyors to undertake any work required there on behalf of this Society.

So far quite a number of inspections have been held under this arrangement, the Surveyor employed being Mr. Manuel Luna who is the official British Corporation Surveyor at Barcelona.

~~Surveyor~~ In the circumstances it could be arranged in the case under review, for Senorita Navarro to appoint Mr. Luna to carry out the damage survey as for an unclassified vessel and issue his report to the Owners who could afterwards of course pass it on to the Bureau Veritas.

I shall be glad if you will take the matter up with the Owners and let me know whether this course would meet their wishes, it being understood that payment of fees
