

Dear Sir,

S. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 12th instant respecting the steam trawler "INVERCLYDE", from which it is noted that this vessel has now passed into your hands and that you do not desire to continue her classification in this Society's Register Book.

As you are doubtless aware the Second Special Survey No.2 became due on this vessel in January 1936, and her class has hitherto been continued in the Society's Register Book on an undertaking received from the late Owner that all outstanding surveys and repairs would be completed before the vessel was again placed in commission.

The case has received the consideration of the General Committee at their meeting today, and in view of your intimation and of the fact that the year of grace allowed for the completion of the special survey expired in January last, they have had no alternative but to give
