Dear Mr. Kruhoffer,

In the case of the s.s. "ANGLO", formerly the "ANANA" of Thorshaven, some difficulty is being found in obtaining payment of certain damage fees due to the Bergen Surveyor. The position is explained in the enclosed copies of letters; but I think it well to add that the usual course would be for the matter to be taken up with the present Owner of the vessel. Mr. Skogland, however, has clearly intimated that in his view we should look to Mr. Leif Waagstein for payment. Unfortunately Mr. Waagstein has not yet shown any disposition to pay and the fact that he resides at Thorshaven makes communication with him difficult.

The survey was held at Stavanger by Mr. Eide, Jr. in June last and his total fees and expenses
