

Dear Sirs,

S. With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of your steamer "SOUTHLAND", I would remind you that the Special Survey No.1 on this vessel became due so long ago as May, 1931, and the Special Survey No.2 in May, 1935.

The case has been under consideration to-day, together with a communication received from the Society's Surveyor at Dunedin, from which it appears that the vessel is still laid up indefinitely at Port Chalmers. In the circumstances and in view of the surveys outstanding and of the fact that the Special Survey No.2 is already two years overdue, I am directed to inform you that if it is desired to retain the vessel's class in the Society's Register Book, the Committee must require this inspection to be carried out without further delay or they will have no alternative but to give instructions for her class to be expunged from the Register Book.
