The 1st S.S.No.1 became due 5,31, and no part of the survey has been held.

The vessel has been laid up since 1930 and the usual undertaking has been furnished. The case received the consideration of the Committee on the 3rd July last, the Special Survey being then more than 2 years overdue but a general examination/ ~~being~~ ^{was not} required.

In reply to an inquiry the Dunedin Surveyor writes that the vessel is still laid up indefinitely.

In view of the fact that the Special Survey is now more than three years overdue, it is a matter for consideration whether the general examination should now ^{be} required to be held.
