due to encountering heavy weather from 8th to 11th January, 1942,
during loaded voyage Botwood, Newfoundland to Galveston, Texas,
and consequential part flooding of No.1 cargo hold, alleged
fouling the vessel's stern by S/S "Cardonia", at Galveston, on
February 13th, 1942, Docking Survey, Owners repairs, etc.,
and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's
Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and
that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed,
viz. #100A1, with fresh record of Survey 2,42 (February, 1942),
