**SAPINERO.**—Plymouth. March 29. — Steamer Sapinero, from Philadelphia, cargo wheat, convoyed here last night by steamer Pendragon Castle, Galveston for Havre. Sapinero experienced heavy weather, had about 7 ft. water in holds and jettisoned a large quantity of cargo. Water now nearly all out.

#### HOG ISLAND SHIP AT PLYMOUTH.

Satisfaction was expressed in the London Marine Insurance Market yesterday that the American steamer Sapinero reached Plymouth, as reported in *The Times* of yesterday, under her own steam, although she had 7ft. of water in the hold and arrived at the cost of a fierce fight by the crew to save the vessel during violent weather, and the jettison of a thousand tons of grain and a large quantity of oil fuel.

Special interest surrounds the ship, since she is one of the new products of the great Hog Island shipyard. She is of 5,735 tons gross, and is driven by steam turbines built by the General Electric Company, of Schenectady. The Sapinero left Philadelphia, where she was built, on March 12, and was making her first trip across the Atlantic.
