Dear Sirs,

I beg to acquaint you that the Society's Surveyors at Kobe have forwarded to this Office a copy of your letter of the 18th ultimo, addressed to them, from which it is noted that the Steamers "KAO SING", "SHOU SING", "CHI SING" and "CHAO SING" have now been transferred to your Ownership and renamed the "YAMAGIRU MARU", "YAMAYURI MARU", "YAMAHAGI MARU" and "YAMAHIZI MARU" respectively, and that you do not desire to maintain the classification of these vessels with this Society.

The cases have been submitted for the consideration of the Committee at their meeting today, and I am directed to say that, in the circumstances, instructions have been given for the vessels' characters to be withdrawn from the Society's Register Book and Three Dots (...) inserted in lieu thereof in each case, indicating withdrawal of class at Owners' request.
