Dear Sirs,

The Ministry of War Transport state that the steam trawler "SARGON" (No. 63579 in the Register Book) is being released from Government service and returned to her Owners, the St. Andrew's Steam Fishing Co. Ltd. This is one of the trawlers originally owned by the Standard Steam Fishing Co. Ltd. who withdrew their fleet from classification in 1938.

Early in 1942, Mr. Parkes of the Boston Deep Sea Fishing & Ice Co. and allied companies, stated he had purchased a number of vessels formerly owned by the Standard Steam Fishing Co. Ltd. and he applied for reinstatement of class. As, however, they were requisitioned by the Admiralty at the time, the Committee agreed to replace the (...) by a record of "LOCAL Steam Trawler (Reclassification Contemplated)" but I thought it well to apprise you of the circumstances in which the special notation was put into the Register Book.

It is concluded a full Special Survey will now be held but doubtless you will be able to arrange details on the spot.
