Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 11th instant, respecting the Engines "2.8" constructed by Messrs. D. & W. Henderson, and transferred to Messrs. J. G. Kincaid & Co., and purchased by the Canadian Ministry of Marine, I have to inform you that Messrs. Kincaid & Co., were advised on the 15th August last, that the special fee of £50 to be charged for the survey of each set of engines had been agreed with the Canadian Government, and if their contract provides for the payment of this fee, the same should be collected from Messrs. Kincaid & Co. If, however, this is not the case, an account will be rendered from this Office to the Canadian Government, on receiving further advice from you on the matter.

At the same time I have to add that no fee will be chargeable to Messrs. D. & W. Henderson for the special duties carried out in regard to the specification, the agreed fee of £50 being inclusive of this work.

It is observed that a copy of a certificate signed by Mr. Easthope and Mr. Murray is attached to the Glasgow First Entry Report, and I shall be glad to learn whether the original has been issued, and if so to whom this was sent.
