Sir,

With reference to Glasgow Report No. 39326 being forwarded to you to-day on the Engines "2.F" constructed by Messrs. D. & W. Henderson & Co. Ltd., and originally intended for a Standard Vessel, but now to be forwarded to Canada, I shall be glad to be informed whether the fee of £50 fixed for the survey of this machinery on behalf of the Canadian Ministry of Marine will be collected from your office, or whether the same should be charged to Messrs. J.G. Kincaid & Co. Ltd.

I shall also be glad to be informed whether, in view of the fact that all the requirements of the Ministry of Shipping were carried out prior to the transfer of these engines to Messrs. Kincaid & Co. and that alterations were subsequently made to the engines in order to comply with the new specification, the original fee as for a standard engine should be charged to Messrs. D. & W. Henderson & Co. in addition to the special fee above referred to.
