CANADIAN IMPORTER. — Vancouver, Aug. 25.—British steamer Canadian Importer, which left here on Aug. 12, reported Aug. 24, 8 p.m., in lat. 29 49 N., long. 136 25 W., sinking fast; No. 2 stokehold and engine-room flooded 17 ft. water; vessel helpless since Aug. 19. Steamer Cordova stood by all night and has crew and officers on board except one lifeboat, which apparently left before their arrival. Latest report received 4 p.m. to-day from Cordova says Canadian Importer not sinking, no danger, water not gaining. Will wait tug from Vancouver.

Victoria (B.C.), Aug. 25.—Steamer Canadian Importer disabled nine hundred miles south-west Flattery, reported engine fire-room full water. Tug sent from San Francisco. Leaving with salvage steamer Algerine immediately.—Salvage Association's Surveyor.

CANADIAN IMPORTER.—London, Aug. 27.—The following cable has been received from New York, dated Aug. 26: Steamer Canadian Importer, Vancouver for Australia, loaded lumber and general merchandise, sprang leak, wireless disabled, engine-room holds flooded. Steamer Cordova offered assistance but master declined. Owners dispatched steamer Canadian Observer and Canadian Winner, also salvage steamer Algerine to assist. Endeavouring obtain services revenue cutters.

Vancouver, Aug. 27.—British salvage steamer Algerine ordered by Ottawa proceed assist British steamer Canadian Importer. Left Victoria last evening; Logan on board.
