I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 20th inst. regarding copy of the proceedings at inquiry and am much surprised at your action in this matter.

As intimated in my telegram of the 15th inst., the incurring of any expense on behalf of the Society in this connection is considered unjustifiable, and, especially having regard to my telegram referred to, it is not understood why you have made the payment of \$150. mentioned in your letter without again referring the subject to me.

I might add that it would appear from your statement of the case that no written application was made by yourself, and further that it was not your intention to request any such document as has now been supplied to you.
