

Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 14th instant requesting to be furnished with the marks on the cylinders on the Steam Trawler "AVANT GARDE" apparently built by Messrs. Cochran & Sons Ltd., and engined by Messrs. Jones & Smith Ltd., of this port, and in reply have to acquaint you that the original L. P. cylinder that was cast for this number viz.: No. 3185 was examined by me and found very porous, in consequence it was recommended that a new cylinder be fitted and that the Owners be informed, which was done. (See copy of Messrs. Jones & Smith's letter attached to Messrs. Cochran & Sons Ltd., the original contractors of the vessel.)

In order to minimise time the b. P. cylinder of No. 3188 which was a duplicate was used for No. 3185. All three cylinders for this number were examined by me, and three porous plates were found as stated in Mr. Dernaghane's report and Mr. Jones & Smith's manager was again instructed accordingly and it was suggested by me that the Owner's representative

should see the cylinders, but after a few days' time Messrs.
Amos & Smith's manager informed me that the owner's representative
was not coming to this country until the engine was fitted on
board. In consequence of this and also that in my
opinion the porous parts in A.S. and L.P. cylinders were not
serious, and the castings were sound and were found tight under
test, I considered that they should be accepted, as otherwise
it would have delayed the completion of the machinery.
