

herewith submit, for the consideration of the Committee, ^{two} a blue
of a Donkey Boiler, designated No 44, which was constructed by
Newport News Shipbuilding Co. for one of the Pacific Steamship
vessels, "Siberia" & "Korea", and which was approved by the Com-
mittee at the time, but which was not built under Lloyd's inspection;
the boiler has not been tested to the requirements of the Rules, but I
have a sworn statement that it has been tested to the satisfaction
of the U.S. Treasury Department, together with a copy of the tests of
the boiler has been sold to the Owner of the new oil vessel, No 44,
now under construction by the Newport News Co.

The boiler was built for a pressure of 200 lbs per Sq inch, they
propose to carry 180 lbs per sq inch; and I respectfully submit the
matter to the favourable consideration of the Committee.

Kindly return both plans and other papers, as soon as possible,
whether the boiler will be accepted.
