5724 tons gross of London, whilst lying at the plant of the Maryland Drydock Company, Fairfield, Baltimore, Maryland, on 18th February, 1941, for the purpose testing the davits and the gear of the four lifeboats.

Each davit and fall was subjected to a load of 6300 lbs., being 50% in excess of the load exerted by the boat, equipment and full complement of 37 persons, and found satisfactory.

The boats were lowered to the water and restowed in chocks, masts stepped, sails raised and found satisfactory. Boats and equipment examined and found to comply with the requirements of the U.S.A. Bureau of Navigation.
