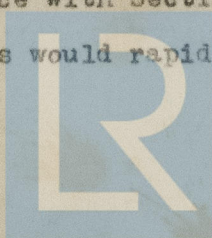

I return the plans, forwarded with your letter of the 29th March last, of Midship Section, Profile, Decks,  $\frac{1}{4}$  scale lines, Stem and Sternframe and Rigging proposed for a Teak Wood Schooner (number not given) to be built by Mr. Blakdinart, Bangkok, with a view to classification in the Society's Register Book.

With regard thereto I have to inform you that provided the scantlings and arrangements as shewn and amended on the plans be adhered to, the Rules in all other respects be complied with, the timber be well squared, free from sap, shakes and all other objectionable defects, and the workmanship and fastenings be to the Society's satisfaction, the vessel will be eligible to be class A.1 for a period of 16 years.

I have to add that where iron fastenings are used in way of metal sheathing it is necessary to insulate the one from the other, in accordance with Section 70 of the Rules for Wood Ships or the iron bolts would rapidly corrode owing to
