This vessel was built by Messrs. W. Dobson & Co. in 1916, and has recently been acquired by the Owners from the Government. Plans were submitted by the Owners and they were informed that provided the scantlings and arrangements as shown on plans be verified by the Surveyors and found correct, that certain structural alterations were carried out as recommended by the Committee, that the requirements of section 48 of the rules for vessels not built under survey be complied with and on a satisfactory report being received from the Surveyor on the completion of the survey and alterations, the vessel would be worthy to be recommended to the Committee for the class A- "Motor Barge", "For Channel and Coasting Service, Harwich, Dover, Dunkirk & Boulogne".

Reports have now been received from the London Surveyors from which it appears that the scantlings and arrangements are generally in accordance with approved plans and the Surveyors state that all the requirements of the Committee have been complied with.

The equipment of anchors and cables has also been supplied as approved in February last for the Figure 1.
