The S.S.No.1 became due in May 1908, and the year of grace expired at the end of May last.

The vessel was originally owned by the London County Council, who gave the usual undertaking, but she has been sold to Mr.J.Parson, of Plymouth.

The new Owner recently stated that the vessel would be retained in the Passenger Traffic, and he was of opinion that it would not be necessary to continue the Society's classification, as the Board of Trade would do all the work required. He wished, however, to discuss the matter with the Society's Surveyor at Plymouth before actually coming to a decision. He added that he intended the vessel to commence running on the 13th instant.

The case received the consideration of the Classing Committee on the 17th instant, and in view of the year of grace having expired, and the vessel about to recommence running, the Owner was informed that the Committee had no alternative but to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a red line (8.09), indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.
