A Reverting to Mr. Campbell's letter of the 29th ultimo, enclosing the first entry report No.4154, on the Turbine Machinery made by the British Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing Co.,Ltd., for the S.S. No.70", building by the North of Ireland S. B. Co., I have now to inform you that in reply to your enquiry as to the collection and allocation of the fees in this case, that it is considered that the most satisfactory arrangement will be for you to render an account to the British Westinghouse Co., for the full amount of the survey fees and travelling expenses, and to credit the ports concerned with the proportion of the fees due to them, and I shall be glad if you will be guided accordingly.

As the fees according to the rules for the complete machinery amount to £45. 6. 0 in addition to the first entry fee of £3, a total of £48. 6. 0, the amount due to the various ports will be as under:-

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Any travelling expenses which are payable should be included in the account when rendered, and it will, therefore, be necessary for you to obtain from the Belfast and Glasgow Surveyors what amounts, if any, should be included in your account when the same is rendered.

I may add that the Belfast and Glasgow Surveyors are being advised of the amounts which will be credited to their port in respect of this case, and that you are rendering an account to the British Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing Co.,
