Dear Sir,

A With reference to the S.S. "No.70" building by the North of Ireland S. B. Co., of Londonderry, under the survey of the Society's Surveyors at Belfast, I have to inform you that the Turbine Engines for this vessel have been built by the British Westinghouse Electric & Manufacturing Co., Ltd, and it is understood from a letter received from the Greenock Surveyors dated the 9th instant, that the Boilers are building by Messrs. A. F. Craig & Co., of your Port.

In reply to an enquiry which has been addressed to this office by the Manchester Surveyors, they have been informed that the account for the total fee due for the survey of the machinery for this vessel, should be rendered by them to the British Westinghouse Co., and the proper proportion of the same credited to the various ports concerned. The proportion due for the survey of the boilers during construction amount to £11. 6. 6, and they have been requested to credit you with this amount when payment is received. If, however, the Boiler Makers are liable for the fee in this case, I shall be glad if you will kindly advise the Manchester Surveyors accordingly.
