In reply to the Secretary's letter of 15<sup>th</sup> inst. regarding the equipment proposed for Messrs. Yawood & Sons' No 235 vessel, I beg to inform you that the owners state the name of their vessel now on the Bangor-Beaumaris Service is the "Lady Magdalen" and that she was originally named "Clutha No 11". Referring to the 1896-97 Register Book, it will be seen that "Clutha No 11" (Ton. S.S.) was built in 1896-7 mo. at Port Glasgow to the class  A — "River Purposes only". (No 871 in R.B.) Her class was omitted at owners' request and "three dots" inserted in the 1899-1900 Register Book and her name left out in the following year.
