In August, 1911, the Owners stated they wished to withdraw this vessel's class. They expected, however, that this would only be for one or two years, at the end of which time the vessel would become their own property.

The Amsterdam Surveyor pointed out that the Owners were obliged to take this step by the Mortgagees.

The case was before the Committee on the 15th August, 1911, and as no survey was actually due no action was taken in the matter.

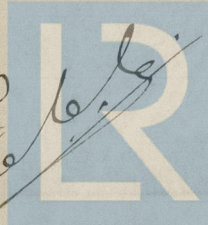
Letters were addressed to the Owners on the 25th February, 4th and 24th April and 19th September relative to the overdue surveys, to which no reply has been received.
