Nature of Survey S.S. no 1 When due 9.12

The Owners of this vessel recently stated that they desired the vessel's class to be withdrawn from the Society's RegisterBook. They expected, however, that this would only be for one or two years at the end of which time the vessel would become their own property.

The Amsterdam Surveyor stated that the Owners did not like to take this step but they were obliged to do so by the Mortgagees.

The Owners were informed on the 15th instant that the Special Survey ~~did not~~ become due until September, 1912, and that twelve months grace is allowed beyond that time to carry out the survey, and it was therefore suggested to them ~~that~~ <sup>whether</sup> it would not be in accordance with their wishes for the vessel's classification to be retained until the Special Survey No.1 is required to be held.

The Owners now state that if there is not any great survey to be passed before 1912 they are willing to continue the classification of the vessel, which they expect will be entirely their own property next year.

It is therefore submitted that no action is necessary.
