Dear Sir,

I beg to acquaint you that the Committee of this Society have had under consideration the case of your steam trawler "EMMANUEL", referred to in your letter of the 15th instant, as regards the examination of the tail shaft which became due in May last year, and the Special Survey No.1 which is also due.

The Committee regret to note that from one reason or another it has not yet been found practicable to draw in the screwshaft for the necessary examination, and they desire me to say that the matter has now been standing over so very long that they consider it should not be longer delayed, and they must ask you kindly to make definite arrangements to place the vessel in drydock and to draw in the screwshaft for examination in order to entitle her to the retention of her class.

For your information I enclose herewith a Circular Letter recently issued by the Committee on the subject of the periodical survey of classed vessels.
