Dear Sir,

I beg to acquaint you that the Society's Surveyor at Milford has forwarded to this Office your letter of the 18th ultimo, respecting the examination required of the screwshaft of your steam trawler "EMMANUEL", and it is noted that although the vessel was placed on the slipway, the shaft was not drawn in for examination.

In the circumstances, I have to point out that the last time the tail shaft of this vessel was seen by the Society's Surveyors, was in May, 1914, and that attention has been called on several occasions to the necessity of drawing it in for further examination, in order to entitle the steamer to retain her class.

The Committee regret to find that this has not yet been done, and I am desired to say that in the circumstances, they have no option but to ask you to make definite arrangements for the screwshaft to be now submitted for the necessary examination, and I shall be glad to learn at what port you will have this done.
