This vessel was built in April, 1914, and classed 100A1 "Steam Trawler".

Early last month the Society's Surveyor at Ipswich stated that the vessel was under survey, and that he had been informed by the Owner that the Steamer was to be no longer used for fishing purposes, but would be fitted out as a cargo coasting Vessel.

The Surveyor was informed of the alterations that would be necessary if the vessel was to be used for cargo carrying purposes and be entitled to a full 100A class.

He now reports that the vessel has been under survey, but is being used as a cargo vessel. Some minor alterations have been carried out, but the additional strengthening etc., required for the 100A1 class has not been fitted, nor has the equipment been made in accordance with the Rules.

The case received the consideration of the Classing Committee on Friday, 13th instant, when it was decided to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a red line (6.19), indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules, and the Owner has been so informed.
