S. With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your Steam Trawler "ENGLISH ROSE", and to the correspondence which has passed with Mr. Matthew Butcher of Great Yarmouth, on the subject of the conversion of this vessel into a Cargo Carrier, I have to acquaint you that the Committee have had before them to-day the Report from the Society's Surveyor at Great Yarmouth, of his recent survey of the steamer.

It appears that the additional strengthening, etc., required for the 100A1 class as a Cargo Vessel, has not been fitted, and that the equipment has not been made in accordance with the Society's Rules, and in these circumstances, the Committee regret there is no option but to expunge the vessel's class with a red line, indicating non compliance with the Rules.
