CHILE (s).—*London*, March 14.—The Salvage Association have received the following telegram from the salvage contractors, dated Montevideo, March 13, re Chile, Forestal:—Forestal: Disappointed values compared trouble. If we fail float Chile by next Friday we will abandon in view of difficulties, and expenses will be too great.

CHILE (s).—*London*, March 16.—The Salvage Association have received the following telegram from the salvage contractors, dated Montevideo, March 15, re Chile and Forestal:—Chile to continue salvage after next Friday, we demand 5% every day plus 50 per cent. salvaged values, assuring we will do our utmost, but very considerable expense. There is a great risk. Forestal: Absence of guarantee occasions serious loss to insurers and salvors, delaying delivery and repairs. We protest against.

FORESTAL (barge).—*London*, March 10.—The Salvage Association have received the following telegram from their surveyor, dated Buenos Ayres, March 26, re Forestal (barge)-Chile:—Forestal: Estimated expenses 2,500/. Mihanovich says 3,000/. Part of the cargo has been discharged. Chile: Less damaged. Discharge completed. Arranging tenders for repairs. Every economy will be used.
