Dear Mr Redman,

You will recollect that on the 24th May last I sent you a statement respecting surveys outstanding on several vessels, understood to be owned by the French Government, and that you subsequently wrote that the Government were going to sell most of the vessels they owned (at a date not named), and the responsibility for dealing with the Classification would rest with the purchasers, but that in the cases of vessels holding our class, which were not sold within a certain time, the Ministry, while waiting to sell at a later date, would place itself in communication with the Society with a view to the outstanding surveys being carried out.

The Classing Committee had the subject before them on the 8th July last, when they agreed in the circumstances to the matter standing over for a time. As some months have now elapsed, I think it well to send you an up to date list, and shall be obliged if you will let me have any further information you can obtain about any of the vessels which are overdue for survey.
